The Engineering Council of South Africa (ECSA) is a statutory body established in terms of the Engineering Profession Act, 2000 (Act No. 46 of 2000). ECSA's primary role is the regulation of the engineering profession in terms of South African legislation governing the Engineering profession. Its core functions are the accreditation of engineering programmes, registration of persons as professionals in various categories, and the regulation of the practice of registered persons.

Consequently, ECSA is the body in South Africa that is authorized to register engineering professionals and bestow the use of engineering titles, on persons who have met the requisite professional registration criteria.

ECSA has identified a need to digitalise its business processes that give effect to some aspects of its mandate.

The aspects of ECSA's mandate that are in scope for digitalization through the development of ICT portals to interface with ECSA's relevant stakeholders include the following:

1. Accreditation of Engineering Programs
2. Accreditation of ECSA recognized training and development Academies
3. Registration of individuals in various categories
4. Maintenance of Members' CPD portfolio
5. Management of Conduct Cases of Registered Persons
6. Recognition of Voluntary Associations
7. Billing of Applicants and Registered Persons
